MINUTES OF THE MEETING

44.1 WELCOME AND OPENING REMARKS BY THE CHAIRPERSON

The Chairman welcomed all to the meeting. Thereafter, agenda items were taken up for discussions.

44.2 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE 43rd MEETING OF THE SENATE HELD ON July 17, 2019

No comments were received on the minutes of the 43rd meeting of the Senate held on July 17, 2019. Hence, the minutes of the meeting were confirmed.

44.3 ACTION TAKEN REPORT

The Chairman, Senate apprised the members of the action taken on the various decisions taken by the Senate in its 43rd meeting held on July 17, 2019. Dr. Ashok Kumar Solanki, Registrar informed that the AICTE vide letter dated 23.10.2019 has informed that the course approved at the level of “Doctor of Philosophy” has been cancelled as the same is not covered as per the term ‘Level’ defined under clause 2.3.3 of AICTE Regulation 2018. However, the Institute may continue the conduct of the course at the level of Doctor of Philosophy in accordance with the law envisaged by UGC. The Senate noted the position.

44.4 ITEMS FOR INFORMATION/ RATIFICATION

44.4.1 General Matters

44.4.1.1 To consider End of Semester Summary Report (Winter 2019)

Dean of Academic Affairs presented the Semester Summary Report. She also answered the queries made by the members during the course of deliberations. The Senate noted the position and approved the Semester Summary report placed at [Appendix I](#).

44.4.1.2 To ratify the approval given by Chairman Senate for Academic Calendar for Winter Semester 2020

Dean of Academic Affairs informed that some events have been added to the academic calendar in consultation with the concerned faculty. It was also clarified that by making classes off on many of the events, the semester is getting stretched to summer and this reduces the summer break duration. To adjust to the need of the Institute, it was suggested that most of such events may be placed during the mid recess, which will not lead to delay in ending the semester. The Senate ratified the approval given by Chairman, Senate to the Academic Calendar for Winter Semester 2020 placed at [Appendix-II](#) and requested to discuss the matter of scheduling Institute events during mid recess. The Senate also suggested to release the Academic Calendar of the whole year together on yearly basis.

44.4.1.3 To report the status of B.Tech., M.Tech. and Ph.D. admissions for Academic year 2019-20

Dean of Academic Affairs presented the details of admissions made to B.Tech., M.Tech. and Ph.D. programs through various modes for Academic year 2019-20. It was noted that the number of applications received for the B.Tech. (CSD) and B.Tech.(CSSS) programs through IITD admission process were considerably less. However, efforts are being made to publicize these programs through personal visits to some of the schools in Delhi. She also answered the queries made by the members during the course of deliberations. During the course of discussions a question was raised regarding the Government's imminent National Education Policy, and whether the Institute has a migration strategy. Prof Anubha informed the Senate that HoDs are working on this. Thereafter, the Senate noted with satisfaction the admissions made for Academic year 2019-20 and accepted the newly-admitted students as per the list annexed to the agenda.

44.4.1.4 To report the status of NBA accreditation of B.Tech. (ECE) program

Dean of Academic Affairs informed that an expert team of NBA visited the Institute on October 18 and 19, 2019 and the decision of the same is awaited. The Senate noted the position.

44.4.1.5 To report the approval given by Senate members through circulation regarding running of a Certificate course of six month duration in collaboration with Tech-Mahindra

Dean of Academic Affairs informed the Senate members that the item was circulated on email after the last Senate and no comments were received. She also clarified that this program will be a part of Industry Outreach Programs of the Institute and is a six-month long program for industry professionals. She also mentioned that IITD may gain visibility through such programs and this might help us increase our industry collaborations and tie ups. It was further noted that the admissions to this program will be done by Tech-Mahindra. Thereafter, the Senate ratified the approval given by the Senate members, through circulation, to the proposal for running of a Certificate course of six-months duration in collaboration with Tech-Mahindra, as per final proposal placed at [Appendix III](#).

44.4.1.6. To report the Graduation lists of May 21 and August 21, 2019

The Senate approved the lists of students annexed to the agenda, who completed graduation requirements on May 21, 2019 and August 21, 2019, and awarded degree in the 8th Convocation of the Institute held on August 31, 2019.

44.4.1.7. To report the Deans' list for the year 2019

The Senate ratified the approval given by the Chairman, Senate to the Deans' lists for the year 2019 (for Academics, IRD, and Students) for students' recognition on the Foundation day, annexed to the agenda. For the list of Dean, Communication, the Senate desired that the list may be put along with the formal document containing, interalia, the objective of

the award and the criteria used for selection of students for consideration and approval of the Senate.

44.4.1.8 To report the case of two foreign nationals admitted through ICCR

Dean of Academic Affairs apprised the members of the cases of Ms. Mirriam Phiri from Zambia and Ms. Tano Agnini Biba Roxane from Cote d'Ivoire who were admitted to B.Tech. CSE and CSSS programs, respectively, through ICCR in the last Academic Year 2018-19. It was noted that due to poor academic performance they were required to repeat the first year but since ICCR did not accept their request for extension of scholarship, they were supposed to repeat the first year as self-financed students. Both of them were given time extension to pay the fee, but they did not pay the fee to continue their registration. Consequently, their names have been struck off from the rolls of the Institute. Both of them have submitted the No Dues Certificates and vacated the hostel to return to their respective countries. The Senate noted the above position.

44.4.1.9 To report the status of Suit No. CJ/1151/2018, filed by Animesh Attri in the court of Hon'ble Shri Gaurav Gupta, Civil Judge Junior Division-x, Civil Courts, Amritsar

The Senate noted the position.

44.4.1.10 To report the status of Writ Petition No. WP(C)6807/2019, filed by Saksham Tikoo in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi

The Senate noted with satisfaction the Order dated October 31, 2019 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in favour of the Institute/JAC 2019. The Senate also noted the admission status of the 4 candidates who have been allowed by the JAC 2019 to join from the year 2020 and 1 candidate who got a program transfer from B.Tech.(CSB)-GNGND to B.Tech.(CSD)-GNKMOD and has been allowed to continue in the year 2019. The Senate also noted that the vacant seat of B.Tech. (ECE) of the Institute will now get filled by a KM candidate for admission from AY 2020.

44.4.1.12 To report the status of Writ Petition No. WP(C) 9090/2019, filed by Kushal Garg in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi

The Senate noted with satisfaction the order dated August 8, 2019 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in favour of the Institute.

44.4.1.13 To report the status of Compliance Affidavit filed by the Institute in the matter of Courts on its own Motion in re: Suicide Committed by Sushant Rohilla, Law Student of I.P. University (W.P.(CRL) 793/2017)

The Senate noted the position.

44.4.1.14 To ratify the decision taken by Chairman, Senate for award of Ph.D. Degree

After a brief discussion, the Senate ratified the decision taken by the Chairman, Senate for the award of Ph.D. degree to the following:

44.5 ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION

44.5.1 B.Tech. related matters

44.5.1.1 Branch transfer rules for B.Tech. CSAI program.

The Chair UGC apprised the members of the Branch Transfer rules for the existing CSE+X streams and the recommendation made by the UGC at its 33rd meeting held on September 27, 2019 to follow the same rules for CSAI program since it is also a CSE+X stream. After a brief discussion, Senate agreed to the above recommendation of the UGC to follow the same Branch Transfer rules for CSAI program also.

Action: Academic Section

44.5.1.2 Fulfillment of core course requirement for a student with backlog in the System Management (SM) course.

The Chair UGC informed the members that with the recent change in the course structure where System Management and IED courses have been replaced with PIS from 2019 batch onwards, a student having backlog in SM needs to be considered for recommending a course with which he/she can complete his/her SM requirement. He also apprised the members of the suggestion/recommendation made by the UGC in its 33rd meeting held on September 27, 2019 that to fulfill the requirement of SM course, the student can be allowed to do an extra CSE course in the last 4 semesters over and above the requirements defined for B.Tech. CSE and CS+X programs. After a brief discussion the Senate agreed to the above recommendation of the UGC.

Action: Academic Section

44.5.1.3 BTP award guidelines

The Chair UGC apprised the members of the current BTP award guidelines that this award is given to zero, one, or more (usually not more than two or three) BTPs in each discipline.

It is also provided in the said guidelines that the BTP award will be given in three categories viz. Research, Engineering and Entrepreneurship Track. He informed that since we now have B.Tech. programs in CS+X disciplines, a question arose whether BTP awards will be given to one or more projects in each discipline. He further informed that the UGC in its 33rd meeting held on September 27, 2019 discussed this matter and noted that earlier the reason for having one award in each discipline was because the disciplines CSE and ECE were very different. Now, since we have CS+X programs which are inter-disciplinary, and a student of B.Tech. CS+X may do a BTP in CSE or in X or at the intersection of the two disciplines; an award in each discipline is not justified. The UG Committee, therefore, suggested that we should consider giving zero, one or more (usually not more than two or three) BTP Awards in each track: Engineering, Research and Entrepreneurship.

The Chair UGC also informed that the current BTP award guidelines are not clear about the cases where in case of joint BTP one of the students is not graduating the same year as others. Therefore, the UGC in its 32nd meeting held on September 11, 2019 and 33rd meeting held on September 27, 2019 discussed the matter and suggested that if in a group of 3 students doing BTP, for example, one student is graduating in 2019 (X year) and two students are graduating in 2020 (Y year), i.e., $X < Y$. Then, the B.Tech. project for best BTP award nomination should be considered for the earliest graduating year, i.e., 2019. If this project is selected for BTP award, the two other students who will graduate in 2020 will be considered for an Award in the Convocation year when they will be awarded the degree. If all are graduating in the same year, say 2020 (Y year), then that project will automatically become eligible to compete in 2020 for the BTP award.

The Senate considered the above recommendations of the UGC and after detailed deliberations approved as under:

1. BTP award will be given to zero, one or more (usually not more than two or three) in each track: Engineering, Research and Entrepreneurship.
2. In case of joint BTP if in a group of 3 students doing BTP, for example, one student is graduating in 2019 (X year) and two students are graduating in 2020 (Y year), i.e., $X < Y$. Then, the B. Tech. project for the best BTP award nomination will be considered for the earliest graduating year, i.e., 2019. If this project is selected for BTP award, the two other students who are to graduate in 2020 will be considered for the award, for the year 2019, in the Convocation year when they will be granted the degree. If all are graduating in the same year, say 2020 (Y year), then that project will automatically become eligible to compete in 2020 for the BTP award. To provide a clear indication about the year in which the award was given, the Senate suggested appending the year on all the Convocation awards. So the students securing the award in 2019 and graduating in 2020 will get the award with a mention of 2019 i.e. "BTP award 2019".

The Senate also clarified that this rule (Point 2 above) will be applicable from the 2019 graduated batch.

Arising out of discussions, some suggested that more awards should be given to encourage and motivate the students. Both UGC and PGC may examine the suggestion and make appropriate recommendations for further consideration of the Senate.

44.5.1.4 Addition of B.Tech. CSAI Coordinator to UG Committee.

The Chair UGC apprised the members of the existing provision in the UG Regulation and the current composition of the UG Committee. He informed that with the addition of another B.Tech. program in 2019, B.Tech. CSAI, it is necessary to make changes in the existing UGC constitution. After detailed deliberations the Senate reconstituted the UG Committee as follow:

Action: Academic Section

44.5.2 M.Tech. related matters

44.5.2.1 To consider the recommendation of the PGC for minor updates in the M.Tech.-AI program

The Chair PGC apprised the members of the recommendation made by the PGC at its 40th meeting held on August 28, 2019 for making following minor updates in the M.Tech.-AI program recommended by CSAI:

“i. Add Math courses (Probability & Statistics, Linear Algebra) to the required refresher courses for new M.Tech. CS+AI students.”

During the course of deliberations some members expressed concern about the short duration of the refresher courses running already for M.Tech. (CSE) students and whether the students will be able to do all the 4 modules. The Senate suggested that the proposal should be first discussed in the CSE Department and then taken forward. After detailed deliberations the Senate decided that the proposal be taken back to CSAI for further discussion in the CSE Department and then processed further for approval through PGC.

Action: Academic Section/CSAI

44.5.2.2 To consider the recommendation of the PGC to allow M.Tech. students to repeat a course for grade improvement.

The Chair PGC apprised the members of the recommendation made by PGC at its 41st meeting held on September 30, 2019 to allow M.Tech. students to repeat a course for grade improvement. After a brief discussion, the Senate agreed to the recommendation of the PGC and decided that PG students be allowed to repeat courses for grade improvement along the same line as allowed for UG students.

Action: Academic Section

44.5.2.3 To consider the recommendation of the PGC for allowing change of specialization for M.Tech. CSE students

The Chair PGC apprised the members of the existing provisions in the M.Tech. Regulations for moving to a 'specialization' option from 'without specialization' option and the recommendations of CSE and ECE Department in this regard. He also apprised the members of the discussions held by the PGC in its 37th, 38th and 41st meetings held on May 7, 2019, June 27, 2019 and September 30, 2019 and the proposed modalities and rules of transfer. During the course of deliberations some members felt that if transfer is allowed the number of students may fall down (say 10 to 5) in the initially allotted specialization. It was also expressed that M.Tech. students take different courses in the first semester and as such, transfer based on SGPA may not be a uniform criteria. Some members pointed out that a number of students initially allotted to a particular specialization do courses of another specialization and finally opt for a general M.Tech. Degree mainly due to feedback from their seniors. The Director (Chairman, Senate) also suggested that there is need to inform students in a better way to take a conscious decision rather than solely going by the advice of their seniors. One of the ways of doing this could be to invite our alumni and other industry professionals to have an interactive session with our students. Prof. Sanjiva Prasad, External Member, suggested to revisit the program objectives to address this challenge. Prof. Dheeraj Sanghi, External Member, informed that at IIT Kanpur the students do courses but no specialization is mentioned and they are awarded a final degree in the discipline. After detailed deliberations it was decided to refer the matter to CSE FM for reconsideration of their recommendation. The PGC was also requested to revisit the M.Tech. specialization, rules for the allotment of specialization and the movement from one specialization to another.

Action: Academic Section/Head, CSE

44.5.3 Ph.D. related matters

44.5.3.1 To consider the recommendation of the PGC for removal of the provision for having an internal examiner for evaluation of a Ph.D. Thesis.

The Chair PGC apprised the members of the existing provision in the guidelines for the appointment of examiners for evaluation of Ph.D. thesis and the recommendation made by the PGC at its 40th meeting held on August 28, 2019 for removing the provision for internal examiners from the guidelines. So far, 39 Ph.D. students have graduated and in the past the Institute has not faced any issue in getting external examiners. Some members, however, were in favor of retaining the existing provision to be used in special circumstances. After detailed deliberations, the Senate decided that the existing provision for having an internal examiner for evaluation of a Ph.D. thesis be retained. It further suggested PGC to deliberate and prepare the proposal/guidelines as to when this rule will be invoked as a special case.

Action: Academic Section

44.5.3.2 To consider matter regarding continuation of fellowship to Ph.D. students (on project funding) who are going for internship (and receiving partial monetary support from the host during the internship stay) with an understanding that the respective advisor has confirmed that the work the student is going to do during internship is towards the project.

The Chair PGC apprised the members of the current PG Regulations which inter alia, provide that a PG student who is on financial assistance may be granted leave during the summer vacation period for undertaking internships, projects etc. This is considered “Leave Without Pay” and during this period, the student does not get the assistantship/scholarship. He informed that the PGC in its 38th meeting held on June 27, 2019 has recommended that for students who are on project/external funding, who go on internship with partial monetary support from the host organization, may be allowed to draw the fellowship during the internship duration provided the respective Advisor confirms that the work the student is going to do during internship is towards the project. During the course of deliberations some members pointed out that during internship/project etc. per diem allowance is allowed but no salary is admissible. It was also pointed out that students can’t get fellowships from 2 sources and should be paid only if they are not getting fellowship from the host institute where they are doing internship. After detailed deliberation, the PGC was requested to reconsider the recommendation to avoid any audit objection.

44.5.4 Other Matters

44.5.4.1 To consider and approve the list of Experts proposed by Head, Department of Social Sciences and Humanities for Selection of LACH faculty candidates

The Chairman Senate apprised the members of the earlier discussions held by the Senate in its 43rd meeting held on July 17, 2019 and the revised list of Experts now proposed by Head, Department of Social Sciences and Humanities for Selection of LACH faculty candidates. After a brief discussion the Senate approved the revised list of Experts for Selection of LACH faculty candidates, as annexed to the agenda.

44.5.4.2 To consider a proposal for starting a nine-month (tri semester) Post Graduate Diploma in Data Science & Artificial Intelligence jointly done by IIITD and IBM under an MoU.

Dean of Academic Affairs informed that the Senate in its 43rd meeting held on July 17, 2019 had considered a proposal for starting a nine-month (tri semester) Post Graduate Diploma in Data Science & Artificial Intelligence jointly done by IIITD and IBM under an MoU and decided as under:

“Dr. Debarka Sengupta presented the proposal and answered the queries made by the members. During the course of discussion, it was noted that the MoU for running this program is not yet signed. After detailed deliberation the Senate agreed to the proposal in principle and requested Dr. Debarka to work out the cost of staff required to administratively manage or run the program from IBM support, take approval from the Finance Committee for admission fee to be charged from the candidates, and ensure that proper Lab facility is made available by the IBM on IIITD campus before starting the program. The MoU should also be signed before the program starts”

Dr. Debarka Sengupta who was specially invited for this item presented the revised proposal and answered the queries made by the members. He informed that he has already responded to the queries/points raised by the PGC in its 38th meeting held on June 27, 2019 and the MoU has also been processed for finalization/signature following the due processes of the Institute. After detailed deliberations, the academic program was approved. It was suggested that the financial component and other operational requirements including class scheduling, staff cost etc. may be worked out with the academic department and the finance department before the final approval is sought from BoG for launching the program on campus.

Action: Dr. Debarka Sengupta

44.5.4.3 To consider the recommendation of the PGC for revision of scholarship and remuneration components of Teaching/Research Assistantship (stipend) for Ph.D. students

The PGC in its 42nd meeting held on November 6, 2019 discussed the matter and recommended that with the increase in sustenance stipend to 35% the scholarship component may be revised to 15% and the remuneration work will continue as 50%. The Senate agreed to the recommendation of PGC for reducing the scholarship portion to 15% with sustenance + scholarship remaining at 50% of the total support as earlier.

Action: Academic Section

44.5.4.4 To consider recommendation of the PGC for waiver of refresher course (including summer refresher module) requirement for the students who are not admitted through regular M.Tech. admission process.

The PGC in its 42nd meeting held on November 6, 2019 discussed the matter and mentioned that since the refresher courses/modules are focused on providing knowledge which is required at the entry level PG program and these courses are offered only during a specific time of the year, it is recommended to give waiver of summer refresher courses to such students who are taking M.Tech. on the way to Ph.D., as well as, to the students who shift to M.Tech. program due to poor performance.

The Senate agreed to the above recommendation of PGC.

Action: Academic Section

44.5.4.3 To approve the release of Regulations for B.Tech. in Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence (CSAI)

Dean of Academic Affairs informed the members that the Senate at its 42nd meeting held on April 24, 2019 had approved the proposal for a 4-year B.Tech. program in Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence (CSAI) subject to making certain changes. Accordingly, the changes were made in the light of the views/suggestions made at the time of the meeting and the program has been started from AY 2019-20 with the prior approval of the Competent Authority. She also informed that detailed Regulations for this B.Tech. (CSAI) has been prepared in consultation with the program Coordinator and placed on table for

approval. After a brief discussion the Senate approved the Regulations for B.Tech. program in Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence (CSAI) as annexed to the agenda.

Action: Academic Section

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to and by the Chairman.
