62.4.1 Reporting Items

62.4.1.1 To report the status of Cycle 3 NAAC accreditation

For Cycle 3 NAAC accreditation, the AQAR for AY 2021-22 has been initiated, and the deadline for filling out the form is extended till April 30, 2024.

62.5 ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION

62.5.1 UG Matters

62.5.1.1 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to include the design courses in the Minor in Entrepreneurship (ENT) regulations.

The Senate, in its 60th meeting, discussed the inclusion of the following two courses in the Minor in Entrepreneurship (ENT) regulations and suggested AAC discuss it further and come up with proper justification for further consideration in Senate:

Design for Artificial Intelligence driven Products (DES 529)
The Business of Artificial Intelligence (DES 530)

In 36th AAC, Prof. Pankaj Vajpayee presented the justification as mentioned below;

Artificial Intelligence is creating waves as big and small firms rush to launch new products, solutions, and companies. However, the question remains about how to create a sustainable business from AI. Converting technology into a tangible, viable business proposition requires an extensive understanding of customer behaviour, competitive landscape, business models, marketing, sales, partner management, fundraising, hiring, and executing toward a real product market fit.

The courses leverage and build upon the core thinking behind some of the Columbia Business School's entrepreneurship and Stanford School of Engineering courses. Using a combination of management principles, case studies, real-life use cases, and the instructor's 28 years of global experience as a tech corporate leader, entrepreneur, and investor, the course focuses on the nuances of making a successful AI technology business.

Additionally, Dr. Richa Gupta added that the course contents also have several topics related to innovation, product development lifecycle and business development, which aligns well with the overall domain of entrepreneurship and hence the minor.

With the above justification, the AAC recommended adding these courses to the Minor in Entrepreneurship regulations.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

62.5.1.2 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee related to Undergraduate Transcript.

An Internal committee discussed the issues related to undergraduate transcripts. The AAC in its 36th meeting, discussed the recommendation of the committee and concluded the following:

- The published result in any semester will not be changed due to the removal of the worst grade in the later semester as per the UG regulation. This is a basic principle of result publication for all programs.
- Students who have not completed the graduation requirements will only be provided with a “Provisional Transcript”. After graduation, the provisional word will be removed. This is applicable to all programs.
- The transcript issue date will be mentioned in the transcript of all the programs.
- UG students will be given the option to suggest the worst grade courses to be removed from the CGPA count (if they have done extra credits from the baseline) after every 6th, 7th, or 8th semester up to the cap of 8 credits as per the current regulations.
- If a student has submitted the option of worst course after the 6th semester, then he/she will also have the choice of changing the courses of worst grades to be uncounted after their 7th and 8th semester, too, provided if they have done extra credits from the baseline. But it will not bring any change to the cgpa calculation of previous semesters.
- If a student is removing the worst courses in the 6th / 7th / 8th semester then it will reflect in the footnotes for each semester separately (if applicable). For example, the CSExxx course has been removed from the CGPA calculation of Semester 6.
- Also, some UG students are doing extra IP/IS/UR credits beyond the mentioned credit limits in the regulations, which is removed from the CGPA count and total credit count.
- Students can do extra IP/IS/UR credits, but this will also be counted within the upper limit of 8 credits of the CGPA replacement policy. This may be clarified in the regulations.
- As BTP is done with either 8, 10 or 12 credits to complete a BTP project, additional credits will not be allowed
- For incomplete BTP, the credits and grade obtained will not be counted towards total credits and CGPA calculation at the end of their program. This will not count towards the 8-credit replacement policy as the regulation states that incomplete BTP will not count towards graduation requirements. This may be suitably incorporated in the BTP guidelines and students should be informed regularly in this regard.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

62.5.1.3 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to update the number of awards in “Medal for All Round Performance” for undergraduate students.

The AAC, in its 37th meeting, discussed the proposal from the student senate to increase the number of awards in the “Medal for All Round Performance” for undergraduate students. The AAC recommended increasing it from one to two (jointly) within a program regardless of the number of students in each program to reward only the exceptional candidates. All other guidelines, like eligibility and evaluation, will remain the same.

Current guidelines:

This will be given to up to one student in each program for the overall performance in curricular and extracurricular activities.

Proposed guidelines:

This will be given to up to one or two student(s) in each program for the overall performance in curricular and extracurricular activities. The second medal will be awarded jointly only to recognise two exceptional students in a program.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

62.5.2 PG Matters

62.5.2.1 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to clarify the applicability of travel grants in the Professional Development Account (PDA) guidelines for Ph.D. Students.

The AAC, in its 35th meeting, discussed PDA guidelines for Ph.D. students and noted that currently, no timeline is mentioned in the guidelines for the utilisation of travel grants. Hence, the AAC recommended that a Ph.D. student can utilise this travel grant till their thesis defense.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

62.5.2.2 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to revise the Eligibility Criteria for Ph.D. Admission in CB Department

With the recommendation of CB Department, the AAC, in its 37th and 38th meeting, discussed and recommended the below revision of the eligibility criteria for Ph.D. Admission to CB Department.

Current Eligibility Criteria:

“Candidates must have a BTech / BE / B.Pharma / M.Pharma / MTech / MS / ME /MCA / MSc / M.B.B.S. or equivalent to be eligible to apply.

AND

Candidates must have a CGPA of at least 6.5 on a scale of 10 (or equivalent) or 60% (**applicable for all degrees**)”

Proposed Eligibility Criteria:

Candidates must have a BTech / BE / B.Pharma / M.Pharma / MTech / MS / ME /MCA / MSc / M.B.B.S./**BDS** or equivalent, to be eligible to apply.

AND

Candidates must have a CGPA of at least 6.5 on a scale of 10 (or equivalent) or 60% marks **in the qualifying degree.**

Changes are highlighted in the Bold letter.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

62.5.2.3 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to revise the Coursework Requirements for the Completion of a Ph.D. Degree.

The AAC in its 37th meeting discussed the coursework requirement with respect to Independent Project (IP) and Independent Study (IS). It was noted that currently, it is allowed to take “1 IS and 1 IP allowed (4 credits each)” or “1 IS (4 credits)”. After a detailed discussion, the AAC recommended to replaced the above with 8 credits of IP/IS or 4 credits of IP/IS wherever it is mentioned in the PG Regulation to avoid confusion in the registration.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

62.5.2.4 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to add New Courses in M.Tech. CB Program Regulations as Bio Electives.

With the recommendation of the CB Department, the AAC, in its 38th meeting, discussed and recommended the addition of the following courses in the M.Tech. CB program regulations as Bio Electives;

62.5.2.5 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to update the graduation requirements of Ph.D. Mathematics discipline in PG Regulations

The AAC, in its 38th meeting, extensively discussed the recommendation of the mathematics department to change the graduation requirements of Ph.D. program and noted the following;

- M.Phil. has been discontinued hence, the category of credit requirements will be removed, and another program category has been added.
- As during M.Phil. program/Other programs, the candidates do less number of desired courses; hence the department proposed higher credit requirements for all other programs, which also includes M.Phil.

After a brief discussion, the AAC recommended the changes as follows:

62.5.3 Others

62.5.3.1 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee for deciding the Penalty for Submission of any Forged Documents or Misbehaviour by students in any form

The AAC, in its 37th meeting, discussed that currently, no defined policy or guidelines if a student submits any forged document or misbehaves with students, staff or faculty members in the Institute. A pointwise offense list was presented to the AAC, and the AAC strongly supports the proposal to establish penalties to avoid these instances, looking at a large number of students and curb such instances.

The AAC noted that for all Academic Dishonesty in courses homework / project-report / submissions, IIT-Delhi already has a strong policy. Similarly, all AAC members unanimously agreed to have a strong policy for all other non-academic offenses to maintain a holistic standard of education.

The AAC discussed each point in detail and proposed penalty pointwise. The proposed complete process is as under:

(ii) Process:

- The Manager (Academics) through admin-academic@iiitd.ac.in will be intimated regarding offense.
- The Manager (Academics) will verify the facts and submit the details to the Standing Committee consisting of DOAA, AAC Chair, PG Affairs Chair and UG Affairs Chair.
- The Standing Committee will review the details and propose appropriate penalties per the above table.
- The Manager (Academics) will intimate the penalty to the student.
- A compiled report will be reported to the Senate every six months for information.

(iii) Appeal Process:

- The student will have the option to appeal to DAC within seven days of the award of a penalty.
- The recommendation of DAC will be final.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

62.5.3.2 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee for the TA Award

During COVID, the TA award was discontinued. It is planned to re-initiate the TA award. The earlier policy is as follows:

- TAs who are nominated by the course instructor **and**
- TAs for whom the general feedback is good and something good has been mentioned by the students in the course feedback.

The AAC, in its 37th meeting, discussed a few other proposals and recommended the introduction of the Distinguished TA award. The updated proposal is as under:

- Faculty will recommend the TAs while awarding TA grades.
- The faculty should support their nomination with appropriate reasons for each nomination.
- Distinguished TA award for TAs selected in two courses in an academic year.

The Senate is requested to consider and approve the above recommendations of the AAC.

The Chairman also welcomed the new Senate members and hoped to receive their valuable suggestions in evolving the right policies and elevating the standards of education at the Institute. Thereafter, he requested Dr. Sumit J Darak, the Dean of Academic Affairs, to present the agenda items.

61.4.2 Items for Ratification

61.4.2.1 To ratify the approval given by the Chairman, Senate to award Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence

The Senate was informed that 43 students in Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence (PGDCSAI) program have duly completed the graduation requirements for the award of PGDCSAI in collaboration with Great Learning and the approval accorded by the Chairman, Senate to award the Post Graduate Diploma in Data Science and Artificial Intelligence to the candidates listed in **Appendix I**.

After a brief discussion, the Senate ratified the approval given by the Chairman, Senate and recommended it to the Board of Governors (BoG).

61.4.2.2 To ratify the approval given by the Chairman, Senate for making changes in the Academic Calendar of Winter Semester 2024 AY 2023-24

The Dean of Academic Affairs apprised the members of the background for making changes in the Academic Calendar of Winter Semester 2023 AY 2023-24 on account of RIISE, E-Summit and with a request for another student event as mentioned in the agenda note. The updated calendar is placed in **Appendix II**.

After a brief discussion, the Senate ratified the approval given by the Chairman, Senate.

61.4.2.3 To ratify the approval given by the Director (Chairman, Senate) for branch transfer of B.Tech. students for the 2023 batch

The Senate was informed about the branch transfer of B.Tech. students of the 2023 batch. The list placed in **Appendix III** was approved by the Director (Chairman, Senate).

After a brief discussion, the Senate ratified the approval given by the Chairman, Senate.

61.5 ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION

61.5.1 UG Matters

61.5.1.1 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to clarify on counting Core / Core elective courses offered in III/IV Year (UG Programs)

The Senate was informed that (i) the Academic Affairs Committee, in its 33rd meeting, thoroughly discussed and concluded that electives of 3xx or higher should be different from the core courses specified in the regulations of CSE, ECE, CSAM, CSD, CSB which will count towards 32 credits of CSE/X courses. CSAI, CSSS, and EVE UG programs have separate regulations in this regard; hence, it will not impact specific regulations of these programs.

(ii) The AAC also proposed to replace the phrase “3xx or above in the last four-semester” with “3xx or above” in UG program-specific regulations of CSE, ECE, CSAM, CSD, CSB. This is because our UG programs are credit-based, and the students can meet their graduation requirements by taking courses in any semester.

After a brief discussion, the Senate approved the recommendation of the AAC. It was also noted that point (i) will be applicable from 2nd year (admitted in 2022) batch, and point (ii) will be applicable to all ongoing and future batches.

61.5.1.2 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee regarding the conversion of Grading for exchange courses done at the SDU

The Dean of Academic Affairs informed the members that IIIT-Delhi has an MoU with the University of Southern Denmark, SDU, for academic collaboration, faculty and student exchange. The MoU does not mention the grade conversion guidelines. As per the current guidelines, if it is not mentioned specifically in the MoU, then the grades will not be counted towards CGPA; only the credits will be considered for graduation requirements.

This point was discussed in the 34th AAC meeting, and the AAC recommended adding the below mapping to the MoU:

After detailed deliberations the Senate agreed to the recommendation of the AAC to add the above mapping to the MoU.

61.5.1.3 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee regarding the qualification of a supervisor for guiding the ENT BTP track

The Senate was informed that the AAC, in its 34th meeting, noted that currently only the regular and visiting faculty having a Ph.D. can guide a BTP. Following a detailed discussion, the AAC recommended that a full-time Professor of Practice (PoP) be permitted to oversee the ENT BTP track as an advisor. There will be no other change in BTP guidelines.

After a brief deliberation the Senate agreed to the recommendation of the AAC.

Action: Academic Section

61.5.1.4 To consider the request of the terminated UG students for re-consideration of studentship

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the list of students who were issued termination, which was also circulated as a tabled item. The Senate noted that there are a total of 61 students, out of which 43, 9, and 9 students were issued termination for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd time, respectively. The Dean informed all the members that all the students appealed to re-consider their studentship, which was discussed in the 35th AAC.

All the Senate members took serious note of it and, after in length discussion agreed to the following:

- The Senate directed that the parents of all the students should visit the campus physically to submit an appeal request jointly with the student.
- The appeal will be considered for the students who were issued termination for the 1st or 2nd time.
- For the 3rd termination case, the appeals will be put up to an internal committee. The committee will submit the final recommendation to the Chairman, Senate.

The Senate also suggested working on the following to minimise these numbers:

- It was proposed to relook the policy of termination.
- Find ways to help these students, ensure regularity in academic activities and attendance
- Regular interaction with B.Tech. Coordinators, HoD and Counsellors.
- Strengthening the mentorship program and finding alternatives beyond the mentorship program.

Action: Academic Section & All Departments

61.5.1.5 To discuss the status of the UG students on extension

The Senate was informed that there are three students who were not able to complete their graduation requirement within 6-year time frame. After detailed discussion, the Senate agreed to the following:

- **Vivasvan Krishna Gadepalli (2016208)** will submit a graduation plan to the academic section in person along with his parents. The appeal will be put up to the committee, which will be formed to look into the 3rd termination cases.
- **Raghav Dev Kukreti (2017082)** has not registered for any credits and is also not reachable; hence, his name will be strike off as per the process.
- **Mayank Rohilla's (2017299)** request for an extension on the basis of medical grounds was approved.

Action: Academic Section

61.5.2 PG Matters

61.5.2.1 To consider the request of the terminated PG students for re-consideration of studentship

The Senate was informed about the termination cases of PG (M.Tech. & Ph.D.) students and agreed to the following:

(i) M.Tech.

The request of Nikhil Kumar Y – MT22045 for an extension on the basis of medical grounds was approved.

(ii) Ph.D.

- The Senate noted that Mohd Umar (PhD22022) and Shounak Chatterjee (PhD21009) have not appealed and would be terminated.
- Vibhuti Dhar Khanduri's (PhD22220) request for an extension on medical grounds was approved for one more semester.

Action: Academic Section

61.5.3 Others

61.5.3.1 To consider the list of students who have completed graduation requirements on 21st January 2024

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the list of B.Tech., M.Tech. and Ph.D. students who have completed graduation requirements on 21st January 2024. After a brief discussion, the Senate approved the list placed in **Appendix IV** and recommended it to the Board of Governors (BoG).

Action: To BoG (Academic Section)

61.5.3.2 To consider the End of Semester Summary Report (Monsoon Semester 2023 AY 2023-24)

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the summary of various activities of academics undertaken in the previous semester (Monsoon Semester 2023 AY 2023-24), including the performance of UG/PG/Ph.D., as per the agenda note. The Senate noted the position.

61.5.3.3 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee for Teaching Excellence Award Policy

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the updated proposed policy for Teaching Excellence Award (TEA), which was recommended by the AAC. After detailed deliberation the Senate suggested to remove self-nomination clause and approved the below policy:

- I. Teaching excellence award to be given to the faculty instead of the course
- II. One of the following conditions needs to be satisfied for the best two courses taught by faculty in an academic year:
 - a. **Small and/or Medium Size Courses:** Both courses with at least 15 feedbacks: The average feedback in a small course ($\leq 75 \mp 5$) is at least 4.25 and/or medium size course ($> 75 \mp 5$) is at least 4.
 - b. **Large Size Courses:** One course with $> 150 \mp 5$ students and at least 15 feedbacks: Feedback is at least 3.75. The feedback of any other course need not be considered.
- III. **Distinguished Teaching Excellence Award** if the conditions in Point 2 are satisfied for consecutive three or more years.
- IV. *Average feedback = Average of "Course Organization" and "Course Administration and Instruction"

Action: To BoG (Academic Section)

61.5.3.4 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to have a provision of Online Classes

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the policy for online classes with the recommendation of AAC:

- It was emphasized that the classes should be held in the physical mode.
- An online teaching option is allowed only for outstation travel outside NCR with leave approved under the "Work Leave" clause.
- The number of online classes per semester will be limited to 3 per instructor per course.
- Online sessions will not include labs and tutorials.
- Online classes should include live interactions between instructors and students. Recorded videos for self-study should not be used as a replacement for online classes.
- An online teaching option must be selected while applying for leave, followed by approval from HoD and DoFA. After approval, the instructor

should inform the DoAA office about the date and time when the class is scheduled.

After a brief deliberation the Senate agreed to the recommendation of the AAC.

Action: Academic Section

61.5.3.5 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to discuss the issues related to the Makeup exam and grade change processes

The Senate was informed about the issue related to the makeup exam and grade change process and, with the recommendation of AAC, approved the following:

- I. The makeup exam should be conducted, and the final grade should be provided within the timeframe of six weeks after the moderation date.
- II. Other Grade change requests should be received within “six weeks” after the moderation date.

Action: Academic Section

61.5.3.6 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee to update the Dean of Academic Affairs (DOAA) Award list.

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented old guidelines and proposed additions to the DOAA award list as mentioned below;

- I. All those who got an average SGPA for last year of more than 9.00 for B.Tech. and 9.5 for M.Tech.
- II. Improvement in academic performance for B.Tech. students: To recognize those students whose year’s performance shows a significant improvement.
 - The average SGPA for last year is better than their CGPA at the start of the academic year by 2.0 points, and there is no F grade in an academic year.
- III. Distinguished list of students with a CGPA of 9.5 or more
- IV. Distinguished list of students with A+ grades in 3 or more regular courses (excluding IP/IS/Projects/BTP) in the academic year.
- V. At most, two members of the student senate based on exceptional contributions as senate members.

Note: Students with academic dishonesty cases will not be eligible for the award

After a brief deliberation, the Senate agreed to the recommendation of the AAC.

Action: Academic Section

61.5.3.7 To consider list of Experts for Faculty Selection Committees.

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the list of Experts for the Faculty Selection Committee and it was approved by the Senate.

61.5.3.8 To consider the nomination of Senate composition.

The new composition will be notified separately and reported in the next Senate Meeting.

61.5.3.9 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee for approval of the Academic Calendar for Summer Term 2024 and the Monsoon and Winter Academic Calendar for the Next Academic year, i.e. AY 2024-25.

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the Academic Calendar for Summer Term 2024 and the Monsoon and Winter Academic Calendar for the Next Academic year, i.e. AY 2024-25, placed in **Appendix V**.

After a brief deliberation the Senate agreed to the recommendation of the AAC.

Action: Academic Section

61.5.3.10 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee for the Outstanding Educator Award.

The Dean of Academic Affairs requested the committee Chair, Dr. Shobha, to present the item. Dr. Shobha presented the item and answered various queries of the Senate members during the presentation. After detailed deliberations, the updated Outstanding Educator Award (OEA), as per agenda note, was approved with the following observations:

- The long leave including the medical may not be considered in the eligibility 4 years (8 continuation semesters excluding summer).
- The proposed prize money from 50K to 300K may be linked to the PDA amount.
- Faculty should be given an option to submit past documents such as course summary which are required for the evaluation.

The revised document with the input from the committee will be placed before Board of Governor (BoG).

Action: To BoG (Academic Section)

61.5.3.11 To consider the recommendation of the Academic Affairs Committee for academic collaboration with SUNY Albany.

The Dean of Academic Affairs presented the proposal received from Suny Albany for 2+2 and 1+1 programs. The Senate noted that the recommendation received from AAC as circulated in the agenda note and approved the proposal to proceed with the MoU.

Action: Academic Section & Respective Dept.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to and by the Chair.
